Position Summary

We are seeking an experienced Science Department Chair devoted to assessing and developing science curriculum and leading outstanding teachers through collaboration and relationship-building. Laurel Department Chairs are part of a forward-thinking curricular team that examines best practices, leadership strategies, and curricular issues. Laurel Chairs work with Division Directors as part of the evaluative process for department members. They are responsible for the pedagogical approach of their departments, including the shaping of curricular design, scope, and sequence; the implementation of our curricular philosophy; the use of the Butler Campus; and the integration of LCRG research, Facing History and Ourselves, and equity and inclusion skills into the curricular sequence of their department. They also have oversight of the professional development needs of their departments. We expect that, as a curricular leader at Laurel, a Department Chair will also be excited about working with students outside of the classroom, particularly through our signature programs such as Capstone, LifeSkills, and Dream, Dare, Do programming.

Duties and responsibilities include:

- Preparation and implementation of daily lessons
- Delivery of assignments and timely evaluation of all relevant class work and student progress
- Design and implementation of appropriate, authentic assessments and support of individual students.
- Timely and proactive communication with parents about student progress
- Advising of a small group of students
- Collaboration with other members of the faculty, administration and staff on experiential, interdisciplinary and community-based opportunities that add to the school community
- Active participation in all faculty and staff meetings
- Effective and timely communication with varied school constituencies in person and through email and voicemail
- Support of divisional and school-wide initiatives through committee work, where appropriate
- Instruction of students as a Dream, Dare, Do or LifeSkills facilitator

- Supervision and/or participation in non-academic activities, including lunch, study halls, dances, class trips, etc

Required Qualifications

The successful candidate should be eager to teach both Middle and/or Upper School science and should have at least seven years of teaching experience. Previous teaching experience with Chemistry and Biology at both the College Prep and AP levels and/or Computer Science/Engineering is a particular asset. Potential candidates ideally hold an advanced degree in a discipline of science or educational leadership. The candidate should demonstrate a track record of innovative curricular thinking and design and a passion for implementing pedagogy best suited to a variety of learners. Successful candidates will possess a positive attitude, excellent written and verbal skills, strong organizational skills, and proven success within a work setting that requires collaboration, cooperation, and collegiality. The candidate must possess or acquire and maintain a State of Ohio issued teaching certificate. The school welcomes the opportunity to continue to find ways to diversify our faculty
