Position Summary

We are seeking a dynamic and talented teacher who can teach Engineering and Computer Science and direct the school Makerspace. The ideal teacher will create a rich, inquiry-based, learning environment and offer a variety of instruction including lab work, discussions and research projects. S/he will have the ability to work collaboratively with other STEM teachers and develop and deliver effective lessons that differentiate instruction to a diverse group of learners.

Duties and responsibilities include:

- Experience developing inquiry and project based learning assignments for a variety of student competencies
- Have had regular experience building and developing with one or more contemporary programming languages, including Java, Python, C++, Javascript, Ruby, Go, etc.
- Utilize curricula that reflect the diverse educational, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds of the students served.
- Embrace and foster non-conventional, collaborative approaches to teaching and learning through problem-solving methodologies, driven by student inquiry
- Experience utilizing hand tools, 3D printers, and laser cutters is preferred
- Experience with robotics, especially Vex is desirable
- Timely and proactive communication with parents about student progress
- Advising of a small group of students
- Collaboration with other members of the faculty, administration and staff on experiential, interdisciplinary and community-based opportunities that add to the school community
- Active participation in all faculty and staff meetings
- Effective and timely communication with varied school constituencies in person and through email and voicemail
- Support of divisional and school-wide initiatives through committee work, where appropriate
- Instruction of students as a Dream, Dare, Do or LifeSkills facilitator

- Supervision and/or participation in non-academic activities, including lunch, study halls, dances, class trips, etc.

Required Qualifications:

The successful candidate will hold a Bachelor of Science or graduate degree in Computer Science, Engineering, Mathematics, or a Science or related fields. Prior experience teaching in a high school setting is an asset and demonstrated experience with curriculum design and development is preferred. Candidates for Laurel teaching positions should be enthusiastic about pedagogy, particularly inquiry-based approaches and differentiated implementation that is best suited to a variety of learners. Successful candidates will possess a positive attitude, excellent written and verbal skills, strong organizational skills, and proven success within a work setting that requires collaboration, cooperation, and collegiality.
