Reporting to the head of school, the head of lower school serves as a member of the senior leadership team, comprised of division and department heads, working collaboratively to fulfill the school's mission of preparing students for college and life.

The head of lower school works closely with lower school families to help nurture students' educational growth and character development while also leading teachers in strengthening the Lower School's culture of learning as it considers new pedagogies to build on Country Day's dynamic learning environment.

- Provide professional growth and development opportunities for faculty and staff.
- Stay abreast of licensing standards and processes to ensure compliance with state standards.
- Assist in the admission process for evaluating lower school applicants and participate as a member of the school's enrollment/management team to aid its recruitment and retention efforts.
